**Invocation**

**Old Testament Scripture – Ecclesiastes 12:1-7**

<sup>1</sup> Remember your Creator in the days of your youth,  
before the days of trouble come  
and the years approach when you will say,  
“I find no pleasure in them”—  
<sup>2</sup> before the sun and the light  
and the moon and the stars grow dark,  
and the clouds return after the rain;  
<sup>3</sup> when the keepers of the house tremble, and the strong men stoop,  
when the grinders cease because they are few,  
and those looking through the windows grow dim;  
<sup>4</sup> when the doors to the street are closed

and the sound of grinding fades;  
when people rise up at the sound of birds,  
but all their songs grow faint;  
<sup>5</sup> when people are afraid of heights and of dangers in the streets;  
when the almond tree blossoms and the grasshopper drags itself  
along and desire no longer is stirred.  
Then people go to their eternal home  
and mourners go about the streets.  
<sup>6</sup> Remember him—before the silver cord is severed,  
and the golden bowl is broken;  
before the pitcher is shattered at the spring,  
and the wheel broken at the well,  
<sup>7</sup> and the dust returns to the ground it came from,  
and the spirit returns to God who gave it.

**Scripture Reading** – John 4:43-54

<sup>43</sup> After the two days he left for Galilee. <sup>44</sup> (Now Jesus himself had pointed out that a prophet has no honor in his own country.) <sup>45</sup> When he arrived in Galilee, the Galileans welcomed him. They had seen all that he had done in Jerusalem at the Passover Festival, for they also had been there. <sup>46</sup> Once more he visited Cana in Galilee, where he had turned the water into wine. And there was a certain royal official whose son lay sick at Capernaum. <sup>47</sup> When this man heard that Jesus had arrived in Galilee from Judea, he went to him and begged him to come and heal his son, who was close to death.

<sup>48</sup> “Unless you people see signs and wonders,” Jesus told him, “you will never believe.” <sup>49</sup> The royal official said, “Sir, come down before my child dies.” <sup>50</sup> “Go,” Jesus replied, “your son will live.”

The man took Jesus at his word and departed. <sup>51</sup> While he was still on the way, his servants met him with the news that his boy was living. <sup>52</sup> When he inquired as to the time when his son got better, they said to him, “Yesterday, at one in the afternoon, the fever left him.”

<sup>53</sup> Then the father realized that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, “Your son will live.” So he and his whole household believed. <sup>54</sup> This was the second sign Jesus performed after coming from Judea to Galilee.



### **Old Testament**

Noah & the Flood – rained 40 days & nights

Israelites 40 days to spy Canaan, 40 years in wilderness

### **New Testament**

Jesus tempted in wilderness 40 days & nights

40 days between Resurrection & Ascension

### **Lent**

40 days of Self-examination, Self-denial,

Confession & Repentance, Prayer, Fasting, Alms
